Philosophy of Refereeing in U6, U7, U8

In the younger player game the Referee is much more of a friendly guide than a rule enforcer

The referee's job is to keep the players safe and happy. Stop unsafe, unfair behavior. They'll have fun

Young players that commit technical errors (like improperly taking a throw-in), in general, should be given a second chance

Young players should never be subjected to public humiliation

Guiding Principle: Safe, Fun & Fair

U6, U7, U8 rules differ from the normal rules of soccer:

- We do not call offside so no Assistant Referees are needed
- No penalty kicks are awarded
- No slide tackling allowed
- No intentional headers allowed
- All Free Kicks are direct (DFK)
- Be lenient on throw-ins
- Be extra protective of goalkeepers
- No misconduct cards shown ever
- Size 3 ball


Players and Game Duration

 - 35 minute practice followed by 25 minute game with two 10-minute halves
- G7: 4v4 (no keeper), 45 minute game with two 20-minute halves
- B7: 3v3 (no keeper), 45 minute game with two 20-minute halves
- G8 and B8:
 - 4v4 (no keeper)
 - 45 minute game with two 20-minute halves
- All Divisions: Two substitution breaks per half of the game










Restart is a corner kick:








Goal scored – restart is a center kick

Try not to diminish the effect of the whistle by blowing too often. Let doubtful or trifling infractions "slide" and whistle for what <u>matters</u>.

Time Keeping

The previous game ran over by 5 minutes.
 Is it ok to end 5 minutes late?

- An attacker was in front of the goal with the ball. As he was about to shoot, the referee gave the final whistle and ended the game. Was the referee's decision fair?
- How long is a water break? Subs break?
- How long is half time?


- No in WSSL all games must end on time, and 5 minutes before the start time of the next game on that field.
- Probably yes. The referee has sole discretion over time keeping. But use common sense to avoid tears.
- About 60 seconds no donuts or team talk!
- 5 minutes which is not much

Accessing the Referee Scheduler

The system checks your eligibility automatically:

Current Year Volunteer registration at WSSL, Safe Haven, CDC Concussion and relevant referee class (in-person or Zoom)

- **Step 1:** Log in to the WSSL system using your own user name and password. This applies to youth volunteers as well.
- Step 2: Select "Referees" in the top navigation menu.
- Step 3: Select "Referee Schedule Signup".
- **Step 4:** Select a date and a division for the game that you would like to officiate. You may choose to select a default division which will limit your view of available games to that division. You may always choose to officiate games in another division if you would like.
- Step 5: Select the game that you want to officiate and the position you want to take.
- Step 6: Update your self-scheduled selection. You should see your name next to the selection you toggled.
- **Step 7:** You should see that your request is pending (next to your name). Your Chief Referee or Referee Scheduler will approve your selection. You can assume that your request is approved unless you hear from them.



Can I Referee My Sibling's or Child's game?

- Yes!
- WSSL allows parents to referee their own child's game in the early years (U6-U8)
- U9 and older Center Referees should sign up to referee the game directly before or after their own child's game
- Assistant referees may referee their own child's game
- If no other certified referee is available, a certified referee whose child is playing in the game may serve as the center referee for that game
- Even if your own child may be okay with you refereeing their game, someone else may not be...

Uneven Number of Players

- Coaches work this out, referees encourage
- No player should sit out, if by doing so they will not get to play ¾ of the game. Roster size = ¾ match!
- Players and teams should not be "penalized" for having good attendance
- "Borrowed" players must be AYSO registered
- "Borrowed" players should not play if a scheduled player must sit out to accommodate them
- "Borrowed" players must be same age or younger
- Lending players between teams is permissible
- Use the opportunity to teach sportsmanship

Dealing with Coaches/Spectators

Our expectations are that everyone (coaches, referees and spectators) will cooperate, to make the match <u>FAIR</u>, <u>SAFE AND FUN</u>.

99.9% of the time, that is exactly what happens.

But what about that .1%? How do we handle those situations?



Dealing with Coaches/Spectators


- You are not alone Use the AYSO Team
- Keep adults focused on creating an enjoyable experience for the players
- Remain calm and professional
- Intervene early to prevent escalation. A smile can defuse a bad situation.
- Always look to defuse the tension and de-escalate the situation.
- Remind them about why we (all of us!) are here- to make the game fair, safe and fun FOR THE KIDS.
- Report any unpleasantness in your match report.
- Talk to your division Chief Referee

Entering Match Reports

It's not very obvious where to put your match report. On the Referee Schedule you should see a Game ID next to your game.



If you are the Centre Referee then the number is "clickable" and will take you to the match report entry page. For divisions with two side-by-side games, only one match report screen is available so please combine reports into one. For obvious reasons, the match report cannot be entered until after the match has ended. The screen looks something like this:



Then click on "Enter Match Report" and it will take you to a screen like this where you can enter your comments and the score:




